**NAMING OPPORTUNITIES:** A question was asked regarding what size pledge is needed in order to select a naming opportunity. While the list is quiet exhaustive, we would like to use this space to give you the first couple of levels.

\$1,000 - \$9,999 Widow's Mite – At this level are recognized as donors but there are no naming opportunities.

\$10,000 - \$24,999 Contributor level – This level includes pews, kneelers, votive candle holders, servers' chairs, and lighting. From this level, the ambo (pulpit) and one votive candle holder have been named.

\$25,000 - \$49,999 Seraphim level – This level includes the Celebrant's Chair, Tabernacle Stand, Administrator's office, Ministry office, Religious Education office, Secretary's office. From this level the Baptistry and the Reception Area have been named.

There are four more levels for gifts of more than \$50,000. These will be listed in a separate column.
