## Brick Pavers

We are so happy to let everyone know that we have arranged to use a paver supplier who will allow us to convey our message in three lines using twenty characters per line! This results in sixty available characters (including spaces and punctuation). This is a vast improvement over the previous twenty-eight character maximum! Price remains the same at \$300 for a standard rectangular red paver and \$850 for a square (8x8) paver. The font on the square paver will be larger than on the red brick rectangle.

Concerns have been expressed that the bricks at the Parish Life Center are painted on and will therefore not last. Each brick is engraved with high-precision to create the message and then filled in with a polymer that is guaranteed to last. The vendor has been selected to provide the pavers at the Davidson Center in Huntsville, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, the Salt Lake City Olympics, and numerous organizations across the country.
